Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (formula allocation)	Our allocation for this grant is \$481,900. The City Council approved the strategy for this grant at the June 2, 2009 City Council meeting. The grant application is for the replacement of air conditioning units in city facilities.	1	2	3	4	5	6
U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (formula allocation)	Received an additional \$57,045 to be used for investment to rehabilitate affordable housing and improve key public facilities (in addition to CDBG funding). Staff is recommending that the CDBG funding be used on Delia Street. The City has filed for additional CDBG-R funding for use on Delia Street. Broadband Technology Opportunities Program	The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) has begun to populate its website with details regarding programs. Grant applications must have a 20% match, but the match can be in-kind. Kathy Cockcroft attended the third webinar on last week and is current planning the application. Department of Justice JAG Recovery funds	This grant has been approved by the NTCOG and was ranked 25 out of 102 grants recommended for funding. We are waiting for final approval by the Governor's office which is expected by the end of September. A decision regarding the grant should be made by the end of September.  The grant would fund the replacement of 25 Mobile Data Computers (MDC's) at a cost of \$151,498.25	1	2	3	4	5	6
Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program	The Federal Emergency Management Agency will award \$210 million in Assistance to Firefighters Grants. Priorities for funding will be replacement of unsafe or uninhabitable structures, expansion to meet increased demand, sleeping quarters, enhancements to accommodate communications and adjusting for cramped or ill-configured operations structures. Staff submitted a request for \$3.2 million for construction of Fire Station #2. The closing date was July 10, 2009 and we have been notified that the application has been judged as complete and has been accepted by FEMA.	1	2	3	4	5	6
